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Fat Transfer Pre-operative Instructions

\triangleright	Your scheduled surgery date is
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>	You should call Surgical Booking at one business day prior to your scheduled procedure to determine as to when to arrive to the facility.
>	Labwork has been ordered for you in preparation for your surgery, which may include an EKG and/or a chest X-ray as well. Please complete all tests at least 1 week prior to your procedure, but no more than 4 weeks before your scheduled surgical date.
>	If you smoke or use any other nicotine products (including the patch or gum), please stop at least 4 weeks prior to surgery. You should refrain from nicotine products for at least 4 weeks following your surgery as well. Smoking reduces circulation and can therefore result in wound healing impairment.
>	Avoid aspirin, ibuprofen products (Advil, Motrin), Aleve, Naprosyn, Celebrex, Toradol and products containing Vitamin E for 1 week prior to as well as following your surgery, as they result in a higher risk of bleeding. If you are taking blood thinners such as Coumadin or Lovenox, your regimen will be coordinated with your Coumadin Clinic and medical physicians.
>	You have received prescriptions for for post-operative pain relief and for anxiety. Please fill these prescriptions prior to your surgical date.
>	Please purchase 4x4 gauze sponges from your local pharmacy prior to your surgery, as you may need them for post-operative dressing care.
>	Please purchase a sports bra or a breast reduction front-closure surgical garment and bring it with you to the operating room on the day of your procedure. You may purchase through www.marenagroup.com . Often, patients choose to purchase a second garment for ease of cleaning and wear. Be sure to indicate Dr. Pathy's name while purchasing to receive a discounted rate. Depending upon the location of fat cell harvest being performed, coverage of anatomic areas may vary on a per case basis. Dr. Pathy and his staff will assist you in determining the most appropriate garment for your specific needs in advance.
>	Do not eat or drink anything starting at midnight on the night before your surgery. If discussed at your pre- operative visit, you may be able to take selected medications with a sip of water on the morning of your surgery.
>	Wear a large, front-closure shirt and loose elastic-waisted pants to the hospital on the day of your surgery.
